Curriculum

All Forest Ridge students follow a rigorous, college preparatory curriculum. In the freshman and sophomore years we focus on building a strong skill foundation in all disciplines, while also fostering dispositions of inquiry, intellectual courage, open-mindedness, and self-knowledge. In the junior and senior years, the curriculum allows students to pursue areas of interest in greater depth and fosters creative problem-solving skills, flexible thinking, and independence.

With a goal of promoting genuine engagement, deep learning, and student agency, two years ago we completed our transition away from externally imposed, standardized curricula and have removed the "honors" and IB designations from our course descriptions. We have committed to a curriculum through which each student is encouraged daily to take on challenges and to demonstrate skills and understanding at a high level in all her academic work, and not to avoid subjects in which she may need more support. Our education prepares girls for the world they will enter through interdisciplinary courses, development of 21st century skills, and inspiring curiosity that impels them to be life-long learners.

COVID-19 Grading Policy

Beginning in mid-March 2020, Forest Ridge implemented synchronous virtual classes during the Covid-19 pandemic. Since 1997, we have been a one to one laptop school. If a student did not have reliable Internet, we provided a hotspot. Forest Ridge continued to grade students using an A-No Credit scale for second semester of 2020.

COVID-19 Partnership – Sacred Heart Global Academy

Starting in Fall 2020, we have partnered with Woodlands Academy, a Sacred Heart school outside of Chicago, to form the Sacred Heart Global Academy (SHGA). Through the SHGA, we will offer four classes for our international students who have not been able to return to the US to continue their education. Students may enroll in synchronous classes in their time zone with students from both schools.

Course Selection

We give students the opportunity to pursue coursework not offered at Forest Ridge through online learning or at local community colleges. These courses will appear on the student's transcript with a letter grade, but the grade earned will not be calculated into the student's Forest Ridge GPA. In addition to Level III proficiency in an international language, all students must take the following minimum requirements:

8 semesters English, religious studies and social studies 6 semesters math and science 4 semesters art and physical education

Matteo Ricci

For over 20 years, Matteo Ricci Institute has been offering college courses in local Catholic high schools through our Consortium Program. Consortium courses are taught by qualified high school faculty under the supervision of Seattle University faculty. Students who successfully complete the course(s) are eligible to earn college credit. The college credit is transferable to most colleges and universities.

Advanced Integrated Studies (AIS)

AlS is a Capstone-like opportunity for seniors who are interested in engaging in a topic of interest beyond the classroom for credit. Rooted in the Sacred Heart Goals & Criteria, AlS challenges students to gain a deeper understanding of a social, political or ethical issue; to investigate a topic in science or technology; or to explore the experience of artistic expression. At the heart of AlS are five phases: the proposal; a research paper; a product such as a performance or a demonstration; a portfolio; and a culminating presentation. This is a pass/fail course.

Innovative Programs


- US and International exchange programs offered through the global Sacred Heart Network
